RONGOMAI NEWS: (Room 2)

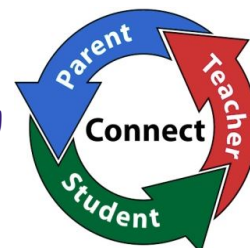
Kia ora Whanau,

Simply go to Skool Loop, click on 'Interviews' and follow the steps.

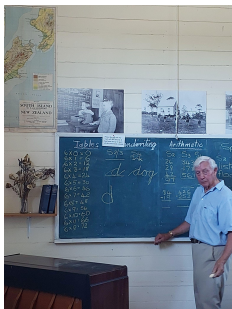

SCHOOL POLICY & PROCEDURE - TERM 1 REVIEW

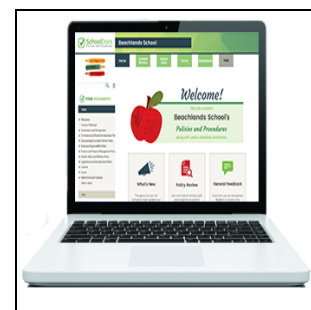
SchoolDocs manages our school's policies and procedures online, in a way that allows us to maintain, review, and update them regularly. This term we're asking parents to review:

Parent (and Grandparent) Tutor Reading 2023

With no sign of Covid Guidelines this term we have been able to start the 'Parent Tutor Reading' programme at Eketahuna School. We are so pleased to have two lovely volunteers - Jenny Davidson & Emily Richards supporting students' learning.

Volunteers are given training in the basic reading strategies (provided by the school) and come along once a week to hear children read and practise taught reading strategies which are monitored. They work one on one or with a very small group of children to give them further practise with their reading. They work with the same children each week and this builds a bond between the child/children and parent/grandparent. The daily, one to one reading with students has shown to be incredibly beneficial - building fluency and confidence
