This term we will be closing the school for instruction on Friday 25th August for our school's Mid Term Break.




NIREAHA NEWS: (ROOM 5)




PŪTARA NEWS: (ROOM 6) Kia ora, whānau




PYJAMA DAY




PLEASE BRING YOUR OWN WATER BOTTLE DAILY
