TE WIKI O TE REO MAORI - MAORI LANGUAGE WEEK

Celebrated in Aotearoa since 1975, Māori Language Week acknowledges and celebrates the Māori language as a unique cultural treasure for all New Zealanders. We have celebrated this very special week with activities that allowed the language to flow with Whaea Peta speaking fluently in classes whilst leading and supporting 'hands on' activities. Tamariki have

been weaving with harekeke, making flowers (putiputi) and fish (ika), making fruit kebabs following te reo instructions from the story book "Kepapa Huarāka" read to them, and in class games such 'Wharewhare', a school version of bingo using numbers and pictures in te reo! Lots of opportunities to use, hear and celebrate the language of Aotearoa.

PLEASE BRING YOUR OWN WATER BOTTLE DAILY




