Container 1: **carbon:** this could include: small twigs, cardboard, old flowers, COLD ash, old leaves, dry grass clippings, shredded newspaper, sawdust from untreated timber.

Container 2: **nitrogen**: this could include: egg shells, apple cores, fresh leaves, teabags, fresh grass clippings, potatoes peelings etc. Thanks in advance...it should be fun!


Parents, all your children should have presented you with our school camp gear list. We're starting to get very excited now, as there is only a little over a week until we depart. Please check this list with your child.



#### TO PURCHASE A TRADITIONAL PRINT PACKAGE

Select the individual image you would like to include on your multisheet. Choose Package A or Package B and add to cart. The package will include your chosen multisheet, a year group photo, and also the free digital image of the photo you choose for your multisheet. (Digital images will be delivered to your email address as soon as payment is made a checkout.) YOU DO NOT NEED TO SELECT THE GROUP PHOTO, this will be added to your package automatically however you can add the year group in the Notes section if you would like to. It will not show in your cart but is reconciled in the studio's system.



#### DIGITAL PACKAGES

Full resolution images are available to be purchased in packages of 3 images, or 5 images. This means you will have a selection of photos, and you can make your own prints as and when you wish.

#### TO PURCHASE INDIVIDUAL ITEMS

Click on the photo you'd like to purchase and then the relevant tab; Prints / Digitals / Canvases / Framed Prints to make your selection. You are also able to view / order images in black and white. The Class photo is only available as an 8x10" laminated print. Please select 'Class Photo" when ordering a single class photo.

#### What is Blemish Removal / Retouch?

I am able to remove scratches, acne or fly away hairs at your request. The cost is \$25 per photo or \$50 for all images if you are purchasing three or more photos.

#### **PAYMENT OPTIONS**

Select Pay now to pay via Paypal - pay by debit or credit card (you don't need a Paypal account to do this, you can log in as a guest. Just follow instructions on screen instructions).

Select Pay Later if you wish to pay by internet banking. Payment instructions will be sent to your email.

Online ordering of photos will close off at 9pm on Monday 20<sup>th</sup> November, with photos delivered to school by Tuesday 5<sup>th</sup> December.
