

What a wonderful year we have had here at Eketāhuna School, there have been many highlights. I particularly enjoyed the swimming sports, it was so good to see all our kids getting in and doing their best having a go and being able to show their skills that they had been practising. The celebration of our town turning 150 was a perfect opportunity for school to get involved and learn about the way things were many years ago, the trip to Cobblestones was great fun and a first for many of our students. Our kids really showed their best self in their amazing performance at the cultural festival. I felt so proud to be part of this wonderful school!
