SCHOOL LOCKDOWN PRACTISE - THURSDAY 18TH MAY

We will be holding a lockdown drill on Thursday morning here at school. Unfortunately there may be some situations in our school future where it is safer to keep the staff and students inside, for example, trespassers and violent intruders (on Police advice), natural threats, ie, a swarm of bees, wasps, chemical spill, and it is best to be prepared. We have walked the children through the procedure earlier this term in preparation and will now have a practise drill. Should the school ever be placed into a lockdown, we will endeavour

to communicate with you to ensure you are informed regularly about the ongoing situation as best we can by Facebook and School Loop. Parents/caregivers, the NZ Police advise that you **DO NOT** come to school in a lockdown situation as this can place you in danger and we will be unable to let you into any part of the school. Children can only be

released to you after a lockdown situation by their teacher or myself. We will communicate directly with staff to keep them apprised of the situation and will also liaise directly with the Police. At the end of the day our students' safety has and will always be
