SCHOOL DONATIONS 2024

A reminder that we will not be asking for direct donations this year as we have again opted into the Government's scheme of funding \$150 per year per student. Parents are still required to pay for stationery, uniform items and out of school sports fees. However, day trips that support the curriculum & swimming lessons are no longer charged to parents. School camps and Year 7 & 8 Technology will need to be partly funded by parents but are heavily subsidised to lower the cost to parents substantially. We try to make whatever we do as affordable as possible for our kura families.

Looking forward to seeing you tonight, please come and introduce yourselves and say "Hi". Nga mihi, Barbara




PUTARA News:

HOMEWORK FOR 2024

Homework is happening in all classes across the school this year, and should be coming home from next week. Tasks will be skill based, set at the appropriate level for the students. Activities will be related to literacy and maths as 'follow ups' to classroom learning. We expect all students in Hukanui, Hāmua and Rongomai to be reading and completing basic tasks with caregivers each night to support the building of foundation skills. In Nireaha & Pūtara caregivers have been asked to indicate on a form, which came home last week, if they will support senior students with learning at home. These forms need to be back to school tomorrow. Homework books will come out next week with clear expectations and guidelines for whānau. A REMINDER REGARDING VAPING AT SCHOOL FOR STAFF, CAREGIVERS & STUDENTS

As per the Smokefree Environments and Regulated Products (Vaping) Amendment Act 2020, which came into effect on 11 November 2020, all schools, kura, early learning services, and kōhanga reo must be smoke and vape-free both indoors and outdoors, 24 hours a day, seven days a week. To maintain a healthy and safe environment for our students and staff, we strictly enforce a no-vaping policy on our school premises. Vaping, which involves the use of electronic cigarettes or similar devices, is prohibited at all times, including during school hours, after-school activities, and any school-related events or functions. We kindly request your cooperation and support in ensuring that our school remains a smoke and vape-free zone. We encourage you to have open conversations with your children about the risks associated with vaping and the importance of adhering to the school's policy. Students



who engage in vaping on school grounds may face disciplinary actions such as being stood down from school. If you have any questions or concerns regarding this policy, please feel free to contact the school office. We appreciate your understanding and partnership in maintaining a healthy and supportive learning environment for all.
